GO AHEAD GIVEN FOR NEW STADIUM

■ Southwark Council has approved the proposed land arrangements for the redevelopment of Dulwich Hamlet FC's Champion Hill, paving the way for a modern 4,000-capacity stadium featuring an all-weather pitch and upgraded,

fit-for-purpose facilities. This decision safeguards the long-term future of one of the club, which has called the borough home for 123 years.

The approval also unlocks major external investment for the currently run-down astro-turf site beside the stadium, which will be absorbed into the wider redevelopment.

This season will mark the seventh season for Dulwich Hamlet Women, since the players and staff of AFC Phoenix merged with the Hamlet in the summer of 2019.

Phoenix had worked its way through the ranks of the football pyramid to the London & South East Regional Women's League (Tier 5) after a title-winning 16-17 season.

After two consecutive second-place finishes and a cup final win, the decision was made to seek out the support the women playing for the club deserved, and merge with an existing men's club that matched their ethos and ambition.

After playing their final league game of the 18-19 season at Champion Hill, narrowly losing to Kent Football United and missing out on promotion, the two clubs would link up and our women's side was born.

Heartbreak would hit the side in their first season, as manager Farouk Menia lost his battle with a long illness and passed away, with current manager Ryan Dempsey taking over and continuing Farouk's excellent work, guiding the side to two top place finishes, only for the pandemic to intervene, and QPR were chosen by the league for promotion instead of the Hamlet in 2021, despite us having a greater points-per-game record across the two seasons.

After the near-miss of promotion to the

National League, optimism was high ahead of 2021-22, but it would be a disappointing one for the side, as inconsistency saw them end the campaign in fifth.

However, a first cup final as the Hamlet was reached, losing 2-0 to Ashford Town in the Capital Senior Cup at Meadowbank in Dorking.

2022-23 brought with it the continued rise of the Pepper Army, our faithful group of supporters, with league attendances averaging 350.

The side would go on a club-equalling eight game unbeaten run during the spring, ending the season in fourth, and playing a match at the New Den on the final day of the season.

The highlight was undoubtedly the FA Cup run, with the side reaching the proper stages of the competition for the first time, with Aylesford then beat in Round One to set up a tie with Tier 3 Gillingham at home in Round Two.

In front of a record 631 fans, the Hamlet could not force an upset, losing 2-1. The 2023/24 season was undoubtedly the most successful season yet.

The team reached the second round of the FA Cup for the second season in a row losing to Billericay Town 2-1.

They would go on to win the league and get themselves promoted to the Women's National League South East on the last day of the



season beating Saltdean United FC 5-1 at Newhaven FC.

Last season saw Captain Brit Saylor retire from football and join the club's board of directors.

The last home game she played was a 3-0 win against Enfield FC when the club smashed the attendance figure with 1,142 coming through the gates.

The season saw average attendances rise to 450.

The 2024/25 season saw the Hamlet finish 8th in the League and reach the final of the Women's Capital Cup where they were defeated 2-0 by Arsenal.

The end of the season saw manager Ryan Dempsey resign to pursue other opportunities and former Arsenal Academy manager Maria Tavares was appointed as manager for the 2025/26 season. The club have also run a

Reserves side throughout their time as the Hamlet. Beginning in Division 1 of the Greater London Women's Football League in 2019, the side would earn promotion to the Premier Division at the end of that season, and despite the pandemic, would be chosen for successive promotions at the end of the 2020-21 campaign.

This meant they would join the London & South East Regional Women's League, competing one division below the First Team in Division One North, and would enjoy a very successful first season at the level, eventually finishing third behind Sutton United and Dorking Wanderers.

In the 2024/25 season the reserves reached their league cup final and played Clapton CFC at Maidstone United.

The game was controversially called off after 20 minutes and not replayed.

WOMEN'S NATION LEAGUE STATES AS OF 11/12/25

Luton Town Women's Football Club, commonly known as Luton Town Ladies FC, is a semi-professional women's football club based in Luton, Bedfordshire, England.

Affiliated with the men's Luton Town F.C., the club competes in the FA Women's National League Division One South East, which is the fourth tier of the English women's football pyramid.

They play their home matches at Sharpenhoe Road, in a groundshare with Barton Rovers F.C.

The club was founded in 1997 as Luton Town Ladies Football Club. In 2000, it formed a formal partnership with Luton Town F.C., adopting the name Luton Town Belles in 2001 before reverting to its current name in 2006.

Early success came in the mid-2000s with successive promotions: from the fifth-tier Southern Region Division One South in 2003–04 and to the fourth-tier Southern Region Premier Division in 2004–05.

They reached the second tier (then the FA Women's Premier League National Division) after winning the 2008–09 South East Combination but were relegated after one season.

The club spent nine years in the FA Women's National League Division One South East before relegation to the Eastern Region Women's Football League (ERWFL) at the end of the 2018–19 season.

They rebuilt steadily, winning the 2022–23 ERWFL League Cup with a 2–1 final victory over Stevenage. In the 2023–24 season, they achieved their best-ever Women's FA Cup run, reaching the fourth round proper before a loss to Women's Super League side Brighton & Hove Albion.

The 2024–25 season marked a triumphant return to prominence, as Luton secured promotion back to the FA Women's

National League by winning the ERWFL Premier Division title and completing a league-and-cup double.

This elevated them to Division One South East for the 2025–26 campaign. For much of its history, the club played at Stockwood Park Athletics Centre before moving to their current venue.

The team is managed by Rob Burton, appointed in June 2022, who has overseen the recent promotions and cup successes. Off the pitch, the club runs a vibrant youth academy and community programs, including a ladies' walking football section for over-50s, promoting health and social inclusion.
