CHAIRMAN'S NOTES



I hope you had a relaxing time over Christmas and New Year.

I am pleased to report that the council came through with the decision we have been waiting for by confirming the approval to allow us to start work on the new stadium.

It came a little late for us to kick things off before the festive holiday period, but we used the time to hit the ground running in the new year.

The first phase will see the installation of a new temporary cold store to replace the outside bar at the Greendale End. That bar will be demolished along with a section of the scaffolding cover.

Once that work is done you'll see that site cleared ready for the handover to the mobile phone company responsible for moving the existing mast which stands in the corner of the ground near the smaller turnstiles.

Completing that first phase will implement our planning consent and protect our future while we plan for the stadium build, which considering the recent plumbing failures of the existing facility, really cannot come soon enough.

Both the team management and the club management know there is hard work ahead and I know they are motivated by knowing how much success and a brighter future means to the fans.

WHAT MATTERS TO YOU?

FROM SWIMMING IN LAKES TO GETTING BACK OUT INTO THE GARDEN, HOSPICE CARE IS SO MUCH MORE ABOUT DYING...

It's about living life to the full, until the last moment. At St Christopher's – your local hospice – this is what our team help people to do every day. But with a hospice funding crisis across the country, and just a third of their funding coming from the NHS, they are reliant on the support of our community more than ever. So often, when considering our health, we are asked the question, 'What's the matter with you?' But at St Christopher's Hospice in Sydenham, that question is instead: 'What matters to you?'

For **Danni, 45**, what mattered most was **swimming** once more in her beloved **Beckenham Place Park**. In August 2024 she had just come into the inpatient unit at **St Christopher's** after being supported at home by the hospice's community team. Hers was not the average request but a huge effort from the hospice's multidisciplinary team and with the full support of husband Andy, on a warm and sunny morning in early September, she floated in the lake with Andy cradling her in his arms. "I can't feel my feet, hands or face, but I love this," she said, with Andy adding, "It was such a profound experience, it was pure joy". Danni died, peacefully, surrounded by her family, two weeks later.

But palliative care is not just about the extraordinary, it also allows for the ordinary to reoccur too. For **William**, who has heart failure, the aim was to be able to **garden** again. A six-week programme in the **hospice gym** helped him to build up muscle and now

he is "able to garden for much longer, even more than before." **Ava**, from **Croydon**, was referred to **St Christopher's** after struggling with **breathlessness**. She lost confidence and stopped socialising. But after learning some new breathing techniques, she was able to reconnect with her community. For **Mick**, what helped him was being treated like an individual and not just a patient. "I was a person they all got friendly with. They made you feel different and looked after me so well. Nothing was too much trouble." Six-weeks in the gym with the physio helped make him strong enough to cope at home and, like William, get back into the garden. For **Panna**, from **Bromley**, what mattered to her was being at home when she died. So the team worked towards that from the outset with regular visits and support at home, for her, and for her family.

But this **remarkable care** is only able to be provided thanks to the **generous support** of you, **our south London community**. We **rely on donations** from the public to fund 2/3 of the work we do. Your support can help us be there for more people like Mick, Panna, Danni, William and Ava, and help them to achieve what matters most.

We supported **almost 7,000 patients, families and carers** last year across **Southwark, Lewisham, Lambeth, Croydon and Bromley**. You can help us to continue to be there when people need us

This season will mark the seventh season for Dulwich Hamlet Women, since the players and staff of AFC Phoenix merged with the Hamlet in the summer of 2019.

Phoenix had worked its way through the ranks of the football pyramid to the London & South East Regional Women's League (Tier 5) after a title-winning 16-17 season.

After two consecutive second-place finishes and a cup final win, the decision was made to seek out the support the women playing for the club deserved, and merge with an existing men's club that matched their ethos and ambition.

After playing their final league game of the 18-19 season at Champion Hill, narrowly losing to Kent Football United and missing out on promotion, the two clubs would link up and our women's side was born.

Heartbreak would hit the side in their first season, as manager Farouk Menia lost his battle with a long illness and passed away, with current manager Ryan Dempsey taking over and continuing Farouk's excellent work, guiding the side to two top place finishes, only for the pandemic to intervene, and QPR were chosen by the league for promotion instead of the Hamlet in 2021, despite us having a greater points-per-game record across the two seasons.

After the near-miss of promotion to the

National League, optimism was high ahead of 2021-22, but it would be a disappointing one for the side, as inconsistency saw them end the campaign in fifth.

However, a first cup final as the Hamlet was reached, losing 2-0 to Ashford Town in the Capital Senior Cup at Meadowbank in Dorking.

2022-23 brought with it the continued rise of the Pepper Army, our faithful group of supporters, with league attendances averaging 350.

The side would go on a club-equalling eight game unbeaten run during the spring, ending the season in fourth, and playing a match at the New Den on the final day of the season.

The highlight was undoubtedly the FA Cup run, with the side reaching the proper stages of the competition for the first time, with Aylesford then beat in Round One to set up a tie with Tier 3 Gillingham at home in Round Two.

In front of a record 631 fans, the Hamlet could not force an upset, losing 2-1. The 2023/24 season was undoubtedly the most successful season yet.

The team reached the second round of the FA Cup for the second season in a row losing to Billericay Town 2-1.

They would go on to win the league and get themselves promoted to the Women's National League South East on the last day of the



season beating Saltdean United FC 5-1 at Newhaven FC.

Last season saw Captain Brit Saylor retire from football and join the club's board of directors.

The last home game she played was a 3-0 win against Enfield FC when the club smashed the attendance figure with 1,142 coming through the gates.

The season saw average attendances rise to 450.

The 2024/25 season saw the Hamlet finish 8th in the League and reach the final of the Women's Capital Cup where they were defeated 2-0 by Arsenal.

The end of the season saw manager Ryan Dempsey resign to pursue other opportunities and former Arsenal Academy manager Maria Tavares was appointed as manager for the 2025/26 season. The club have also run a

Reserves side throughout their time as the Hamlet. Beginning in Division 1 of the Greater London Women's Football League in 2019, the side would earn promotion to the Premier Division at the end of that season, and despite the pandemic, would be chosen for successive promotions at the end of the 2020-21 campaign.

This meant they would join the London & South East Regional Women's League, competing one division below the First Team in Division One North, and would enjoy a very successful first season at the level, eventually finishing third behind Sutton United and Dorking Wanderers.

In the 2024/25 season the reserves reached their league cup final and played Clapton CFC at Maidstone United.

The game was controversially called off after 20 minutes and not replayed.

Millwall Lionesses Football Club holds a prominent place in the history of English women's football as a trailblazer and community pioneer.

Founded in 1973 (with some sources citing roots in 1972), the club began as an independent women's team in Rotherhithe, south-east London, during a period when the women's game lacked recognition and support. Initially independent, the Lionesses were overlooked by Millwall FC, the men's professional club known as "The Lions." In the mid-1980s, amid efforts to counter Millwall FC's tarnished reputation for hooliganism and racism, the men's club embraced the women's side.

This affiliation made Millwall Lionesses the first women's team in England to officially partner with a professional men's club—a landmark step in integration.

Development officer Gary Stempel secured vital funding from the Greater London Council, Lewisham and Greenwich councils, and the Sports Council.

This enabled the Lionesses to thrive as a leading force in women's football and the "Millwall Community Programme." They pioneered the now-standard "Football in the Community Scheme" and established England's first Girls' Centre of Excellence, developing players from age 8 upward (a model that later expanded to 42 centres nationwide).

The youth system produced exceptional talent, most notably Hope Powell, who joined at age 11, debuted for England at 16, became the club's record goalscorer upon returning, and later served as England women's national team coach (1998–2013).

Other alumni include Pauline Cope, Mary Phillip (England's first Black captain), and Katie Chapman. On the field, the Lionesses achieved significant success.

They won the FA Women's Cup in 1991 (a 1–0 upset over holders Doncaster Belles at Prenton Park, with Yvonne Baldeo scoring

the winner) and again in 1997. They reached the Premier League National Division, securing promotion back in 2008–09 after an eight-year absence from relegation in 2001. In 2014, they became founding members of FA Women's Super League 2 (now the FA Women's Championship, second tier).

Financial difficulties emerged, with near-administration in 2018. In May 2019, the senior team split from Millwall FC; the higher-tier licence transferred to the independent Lon-

don City Lionesses, who progressed to the Women's Super League in 2025 as the first fully independent club to do so.

The original Millwall Lionesses reformed under the Millwall Community Trust, continuing in regional leagues while upholding their pioneering legacy of grassroots development, and community ties in south-east London.

Tell us about the best goal you've ever scored.

I scored quite a few goals from outside the box. My favourite was in Spain, I got the ball out of my feet



and lobbed the keeper from distance. To earn us a really important point against Madrid CFF.

Favourite moment since joining Dulwich Hamlet?

Scoring a goal in my home debut, in our win against Chesham. It was an incredible feeling to help us earn our first 3 points in the league and to score in front of the home fans. Especially with lots of my family and friends in the crowd.

Hopes and ambitions for the season?

Writing this is January, I want to go undefeated in the league 2026 and get us a top half finish.

Favourite stadium you have played in? (apart from Champion Hill)

Not a full match, but I worked on the Women's Euros in 2022, and after the final I got to play on the pitch at Wembley. Which was the coolest experience.

Tell us something about yourself none of us know?

I used to play the saxophone.

Finally, if you could change one rule in football, what would it be?

No game can end in a draw.

If it's a draw after 90 minutes, it goes to penalties and the winner get a bonus point.

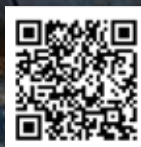
